WHEREAS, the pink ribbon symbolizes the strength to fight breast cancer, hope for a future without the disease, and the generosity of individuals and business who support the breast cancer movement.

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED,** that I, Paloma Aguirre, Mayor of the City of Imperial Beach, California, together with the City Council, recognize October 2024 as "Breast Cancer Awareness Month" in the City of Imperial Beach and encourage everyone to follow the American Cancer Society Guidelines for the Early Detection of Cancer and to wear a pink ribbon to express support and compassion for those who face the challenges of breast cancer.
